Before arriving on Long Island, I heard the typical horror stories from other pastors across the country regarding the first year of ministry. "Make sure you walk on egg-shells!" "Don't change things or the congregation will be upset!" "Watch out that the church doesn't chew you up and spit you out!" In hindsight, I find these comments laughable. I have never been part of a warmer congregation than Grace Lutheran Church. The people in this congregation are friendly and care about each other. You have not "spit me out." Rather, I have seen the immense trust you have put in your pastor.

"He Loves Me Best"

I recently had the honor of interviewing the oldest living charter member of Grace Lutheran Church, Mastic Beach, Mrs. Barbara Davis whose 85th birthday is this October. My only hope is that my words truly convey to you what an amazing, spiritual woman she is. My four hours with Barbara were so very special and there is no doubt the Holy Spirit was with us throughout our time together.

Barbara was born in St. Catherine's in Brooklyn on October 24, 1938. Barbara was baptized at two weeks old and was raised Catholic. Her dad was in the Navy so Barbara spent her early years mostly with her Mom and maternal Grandmother. Unfortunately, her parent's marriage didn't last. When Barbara was seven years old, she and her dad moved out to Mastic to live with her aunt. Both of her parents eventually remarried and Barbara remained in Mastic with her Dad. When Barbara was nine years old, she became good friends with Beatrice Anderson and she was invited to attend her very first Sunday School with Beatrice, which was held at the Mastic Beach Property Owners Assoc (MBPOA). After this wonderful experience there was no doubt in Barbara's mind, heart, and soul that Jesus Christ was her Savior and would change her life.

Grace Lutheran Church was established as a seed church from Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Patchogue in the 1940's. Services were first held at the MBPOA. On May 15, 1953, when Barbara was a sophomore in High School, she went on her first date with a junior named Arnie Davis. They had been dating over a year when Grace Lutheran was applying for their charter. Barbara informed her boyfriend Arnie that if he wanted to continue to date, he must take Confirmation/Discipleship Classes with her so that they could sign the Charter together. He didn't really give her an answer but Barbara says that she was so very happy to see his car coming down the street as she waited to attend the Confirmation/Discipleship Classes. In 1955, Barbara and Arnie were two of the original signers of the official Charter of Grace Lutheran Church.

The property that Grace Lutheran Church and the parsonage now stand on was gifted by Benjamin Herrley, a Real Estate Developer at the time. The parsonage basement with a façade in front was the original Sanctuary before the actual parsonage was finished. Barbara and Arnie were married in that basement on February 3, 1957 with 13 people in attendance. In the coming years as Barbara and Arnie started their family, Grace Lutheran Church was built where it now stands. After years of trying to bring her Dad to Christ he started to come around and he and Barbara's stepmother were very involved in helping build the church.

Barbara and Arnie welcomed their first son, James, in 1958, then Timothy in 1960, then Gary in 1961, and then Keith was born in 1963. Five years later in 1968 the Lord blessed them with their only daughter, Laura. The Davis Family was your typical hardworking family living through the constant changes in the troubled 60's and 70's with one exception. Their life was Christ Centered. They loved camping as a family. In fact, their camping trips at the beach were instrumental in the addition of the Easter Sunday Sunrise Service at the beach which now continues to be held at Shirley Beach. Barbara is so happy that camping is still a tradition being carried on by their family. These days James and Keith are both Elders in their churches and Laura is involved in ministry through Bible Studies. Barbara and Arnie were not only blessed with these five wonderful children but as of today there are 14 grandchildren and 22 great grandchildren. Truly A Blessing Indeed!

Barbara and Arnie frequently held Bible Studies in their home in the 70's. In fact, at a critical time in Grace Church's history when there were major issues with the Pastor, they had 50 people in

their home praying to restore love, forgiveness, and the Holy Spirit to Grace. Around this same time Barbara was convicted to forgive her mother for abandoning her as a child which ended up being a blessing for both.

Barbara and Arnie served Jesus and this congregation in so many capacities over the years. The team taught Sunday School and Barbara started VBS at Grace, serving as Director for 15 years. She served on the Board of Education for over 15 years as well as on the Board of Fellowship which meant she served on Council for over 20 years. Bob Veglucci took over the Sunday School / Junior Church program when Barbara retired from the Board of Education. Arnie served several times as President of Council as well as a very cherished Elder. But one of their most cherished commitments to this congregation happened by accident. Barbara and Arnie celebrated their 25th Anniversary at MBPOA with over 200 family, friends, and members of Grace Lutheran Church in attendance. Soon after this celebration of love, Pastor Ernst approached Barbara and Arnie about starting a program for the married couples of the church. Hence Marriage Enrichment was born. Barbara and Arnie brought Jesus' lessons of love to 65 couples over 20 years. The couple group of five would meet at the Davis home for several weeks and learn to let Jesus be the center of their marriage. Each couple would write their love story through projects and love letters to each other. "Graduation" from the program culminated with a weekend at Pinecrest in Setauket with the group and all other couples who had participated in the program previously. Randy and I had the distinct privilege of being in the final group. It was a life changing experience for us as we learned to share our married life with Christ. Soon after this final gathering at Pinecrest the building was demolished by the new owners. And not too long after that Barbara, her family, and the family of Grace lost Arnie to cancer. Barbara has become very selfsufficient with the Lord's guidance since losing Arnie.

Barbara attributes EVERYTHING to Jesus. She shared that she is nothing without him. He has loved her, saved her, forgiven her, and has made her His own for her entire life. Barbara lovingly tells her children that Jesus loves them but Jesus loves her best ~ like she's his only child. They always laugh, but she really does believes it. It is her belief that we are only in this world to praise and give God the glory. God's Loving Spirit welcomes us, loves us, forgives us, heals us, and invites us to worship and praise Him as His Family. He is our Savior, Jesus Christ!

Our interview allowed Barbara to remember the last 74 years at Grace and how God had truly blessed her through so many ministries. Barbara especially gives praise and thanks to God that she has lived long enough to welcome Pastor Peter Deberny, our new Shepherd to Grace Church. She says, "he is a 'Gift' from God's Heart. He brings joy and radiates Jesus' reflection in all he does. We are blessed to have him."

I am beyond blessed to have been the first and only person to ever to hear the story of the last 74 years of her life as Christ's Child. Her love for Him seeps out of her and makes you want to be just like her. Those four hours together changed me. I now know Christ better than I have ever known Him and love Him tremendously for gifting me His precious child as my mentor and friend. I love you with all my heart Barbara Davis.

When you see Barbara, say hello and thank her for sharing her love and devotion to our church and most importantly to Our Savior, Jesus Christ.
